SFNA Wins Columbia Council of Neighborhoods (CCN) Annual Award (From our President):



The CCN (representing 117 neighborhoods) held their annual awards banquet last night. I'm delighted to announce that Sherwood Forest Neighborhood Association's "Forest Friends" program won the award for Best Program of the Year! The award details follow:

"This Neighborhood embraces the culture of an Urban Forest and advocates for tree preservation and wildlife management. For two years, they have hosted an annual tree giveaway. Approximately 20 trees are provided each year at a cost less than \$200 to the association. Neighbors are asked to apply, are given advice on the most suitable trees for their yard, provided instructions for planting and care, and have trees delivered on National Arbor Day. Participants frequently express their delight and gratitude for a program that provides roots for the future residents. The neighborhood has built a symbiotic partnership with the USC Belser Arboretum, and they partner with SC Native Plant Society to acquire native trees at low cost."

GIS (geographic information system) is a tool for gathering, managing + analyzing data. Maps are created through GIS software (like ArcGIS, Google Earth + more) to analyze physical locations and organize layers of info into visualizations in the form of maps + 3D scenes. Simply put, really cool virtually layered maps.

- **Richland County** has its own website dedicated to GIS, too. Their website allows you to see land parcel data, voting districts, schools, libraries, police stations, wetland areas + more all in HD panoramic or high-resolution aerial photos.
