Police Update: Sgt. Desrochers reported a downturn in crime in the overall area.

Guest Speakers:

Heather Bauer, SC State Representative

Rep. Bauer highlighted her emphasis on roads, sidewalks, and safety, getting funds for our district. It takes new money to be applied to sidewalk issues. This money does not come from SC DOT. Rep. Bauer stayed for the entire Quarterly Meeting.

SC Dept. of Transportation/

Focused on the impact of the 2017 Roads Bill, known as the "Gas Tax," with emphasis put on rural roads, paving, bridges, and interstates. Contact <u>SCDOT.org</u> for damage claims or maintenance issues. An effort is made to address pot holes within 48 hours. The Roadway Information System (RIS) identifies whether a road is state or locally maintained. The Connector E-Edition is a regular email newsletter.

Minutes/Susan Culler: The May 14 minutes were reviewed & passed.

Treasurer Report/Henry Nechemias: Current bank balance of \$2,223. Financial standing is good. The biggest concern is membership dues. Fifty households pay dues out of 270 in the neighborhood. A Membership Representative is needed.
